April. There were several activities in April

that I believe are important as we daily/weekly become the local church God wants us to be for each other, Augusta and beyond. I wish I could tell you that I participated physically in all these things, but God had other plans for me. As a church body you had a great Easter celebration. All indications are that the three services and reservations allowed those that wanted to attend in person for Easter got the opportunity to do so comfortably despite the ongoing concerns with the virus. Praise God, he allowed us to celebrate his resurrection! The following week with BE THE CHURCH several of you were able to go serve in a tangible way with those in our church and community that needed a little help with projects. On the 18th we hosted the food trucks in the parking lot and were able to share space, opportunity to meet others, and open FBC in a different manner to our neighbors and community in hopefully an incredibly positive way. For me personally I spent these three weeks dealing with an infection of the virus with sixteen days in the hospital. It gave me time to pray and ask for God to show us as a church what is next. Personally, I have been so pleased with the Staff's focus this spring on Service and Prayer. I believe God has reinforced in me a desire to be more obedient in these areas as we move forward, and I pray that He is touching you also. We cannot pray enough, that is just a fact. God wants to communicate with us and our relationship with him is everything. Although he is all knowing he wants to hear from us, he wants to whisper his plans for us. He wants us to know how and where we can serve him at FBC. The focus on Service currently is about developing our relationship with God and each other. I am not saying that a singer is more or less important, just that without both, a part of our Worship time together

suffers. We have a core of greeters, but we always need more. How many visitors never get a hello or welcome because we tend to want to catch a friend as opposed to be looking for that new person. Again, we don't want to ignore those in either group, but we typically only focus on one thing at a time, and time always seems to be an issue. So would you commit to getting a little training once a month volunteer to help out? In my time of illness, I have reflected on what God wants me to do. I believe even with what I am doing, I need to consider can I do a little more. Vacation Bible School and kids summer camps are coming up. Will you help with these things?






FINANCE SPOTLIGHT
